Topic name	Masters of the stars: The Romans
Big question	How did the Roman occupation of Britain impact our society today?
Memorable experience	Space centre visit (TBC)
Outdoor learning	Re-enact the Roman Invasion of Britain, Roman army formations Create an outdoor Solar System
Linked books	Escape From Pompeii Roman Rewind Thieves of Ostia Non-fiction texts related to topic – The Romans and Earth and Space.
Reading aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Retrieve information from non-fiction books – Identify themes in fiction – Identify how language, structure, and presentation contribute to meaning – Discuss the books that they read
Writing aims	<p>Non-chronological reports on a fantasy planet / creature</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – use relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, that or with an implied – Use organisational and presentation devices – Use hyphens to avoid ambiguity <p>Journalistic writing – newspaper reports on alien discovery and events related to the Romans</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Use the passive voice to affect how information is presented – Use brackets, dashes or commas to indicate parenthesis – Use the present perfect form of verbs <p>Narrative writing based on Escape From Pompeii</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Use figurative language to describe characters, settings and atmosphere – Use a wide range of cohesive devices – Ensure the consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing
Speaking & listening aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – use spoken language to develop understanding through speculating, hypothesising, imagining and exploring ideas – participate in discussions, presentations, performances, role play, improvisations and debates – gain and maintain the interest of the reader
Maths aims	Fractions, decimals, and percentages (6 weeks) Measurement (3 weeks) Geometry (3 weeks) Assessment (1 week)
Science aims	<u>Earth and Space (linked to DT)</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Describe the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun in the solar system – Describe the movement of the moon relative to the Earth – Describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies – Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky
History aims	<u>The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain:</u> -Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC -The Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army -Successful invasion by Claudius and conquest, including Hadrian's Wall -British resistance: Boudicca

Geography aims	<p><u>History focus this term.</u> locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe</p>
DT aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Design a pop-up book which uses a range of mechanisms - Design and make a soft toy - Develop their skill in sewing, following a pattern and adding decorative elements - Follow a design brief accurately - Evaluate each other's work
Art and design aims	<p>DT focus this term</p>
Music aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - appreciate and understand classical music (Holst's Planet Suite) - improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music - listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory - use and understand staff and other musical notations
Computing aims	<p><u>Digital Literacy (E-Safety)</u> Children will learn to apply online safety rules to real life scenarios. <u>Information Technology – Stop Motion Animation.</u> Children will learn to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - create a storyboard for their animation - record small movement of characters to ensure smooth transitions - edit and improve their work - use software to create their own stop motion animation

What can I learn from this? <p><u>What kind of a king was Jesus?</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How do biblical texts help us understand the Christian idea of a Kingdom of God? - What do Christians believe God's kingdom is like? <p>How do Christians put ideas about the Kingdom of God into practice in their everyday lives?</p>
